Week 3 Action Recap (4/22-26/13)

Monday and Tuesday's committee meetings focused around tobacco tax bills. Despite lots of testimony and hard facts, including testimony from the LA AAP, the tobacco tax bills that were actually heard in committee failed this week.

There were several more tobacco tax bills that were deferred and are likely to not be heard during this session. Wednesday was a very busy day with bills of interest in both House and Senate Health and Welfare Committees, Senate Insurance and the House Floor. Most of the Medicaid expansion bills were deferred and the others were defeated in committee. It is likely that Medicaid expansion discussion is over for this session.

Health and welfare committee bills of note: Senator Murray's SB 185 was a Bayou Health Administrative Simplification bill that LA AAP sent out action alerts around. The bill had to be amended to remove the single formulary provision in order to remove the fiscal note that would have kept the bill from moving forward. The bill retained all other elements. The bill moved favorably out of committee. ****** Note:** there was only one card read in opposition of the bill and it was from the Division of Administration. There will likely need to be work done on the Senate side to move this bill out of committee. Please remain engaged in helping this piece of legislation continue to move through the process.

Senator Erdey's SB192 around Nurse Practitioners has been removed from the active bills this session. Senator Erdey informed the committee that the NPs and LAFP have signed an Memorandum of Understanding agreeing to work on the issues brought forth in the bill. The MOU requires a presentation of a solution to a joint meeting of Health and Welfare Committees.

House Floor Debate: Representative Hoffman's HB527 around the expansion of the practice of optometry was pulled from the agenda Wednesday and waits to be added back to the calendar. Rep. Hoffman noted that there were several sets of amendments that were discussed but all sides could not come to an agreement yet. Please keep contacting your representative to let him/her know that you are opposed to this bill. It is making an impact on the members of the House. List of Attestation Forms Received

As promised, DHH has posted the list of all Designated Physicians Forms (Attestations) RECEIVED BY PRISM AS OF MARCH 18, 2013 AND VALIDATED BY DHH. If your name is listed, your Designated Physician form has been received and is on file with the Molina Medicaid Provider Enrollment. No further action on your part is necessary to

receive the enhanced reimbursement for specified primary care services rendered by designated physicians during calendar years 2013 and 2014. Your effective date for the enhanced reimbursement will be established as January 1, 2013.

Note on Effective Date: Your effective date for enhanced reimbursement is based on the date your complete and correct Designated Physician form is received by Medicaid's Provider Enrollment vendor. If your complete and correct form is received by May 15, 2013, you will receive enhanced reimbursement for eligible services rendered on or after January 1, 2013. If your complete and correct form is received after May 15, 2013, you will receive enhanced reimbursement for eligible services rendered on or after the date the form is received.

In previous guidance, March 31, 2013 was the deadline for form receipt to receive the enhanced reimbursement for eligible services rendered on or after January 1, 2013. The deadline has been extended 45 days due to the recent changes.

Provider Enrollment Update

A Provider Enrollment Update (4/19/13) has been published on the LA Medicaid Website (<http://www.lamedicaid.com>).

To all Medicaid Providers: Please note the following updates addressing Frequently Asked Questions received by the Provider Enrollment Department.

- Effective March 25, 2013, Molina Medicaid Solutions resumed Provider Enrollment operations. Provider Enrollment applications, file update forms, criteria, processes and policies, as performed by Molina prior to February 14, 2013, remain unchanged.
- Current Medicaid providers do not have to re-enroll at this time unless otherwise directed.
- All enrollment documents, including new applications and file updates, previously submitted through PRISM must be resubmitted to Molina using the forms located at www.lamedicaid.com. This is particularly important if your file was changed through PRISM, as there is no audit trail for the addition or change to the record that is available for review.

Exception:

If your provider name and NPI are included in the "Designated Physician Forms By PRISM as of March 18, 2013 and Validated by DHH" list, your provider attestation form is on file with Molina Medicaid Provider Enrollment. No further action on your part is necessary to receive the enhanced reimbursement for specified primary care services rendered by designated physicians during calendar years 2013 and 2014.

If your provider name and NPI are not included in the list, you must submit a new attestation form. This is time sensitive.

- Documents submitted to Molina after March 22, 2013, are being processed in the order they are received.

Professional Pre-Certification Override Process

April 22, 2013

A Pre-Certification Override Request may be submitted by Professional Providers similar to the process that was in place prior to Bayou Health. If the hospital fails to request pre-certification (initial request or extension request), the physician can get their services paid, but the claim must be processed in the following manner:

Fax the following to the CHS-LA Pre-Certification Department 1-888-486-6207:

- Cover letter requesting a Pre-Certification Override
- Completed CHS-LA Inpatient Pre-Certification Fax Request Form which can be located at: <http://www.louisiana.chsamerica.com/index.php?id=70>
- Hospital Admit summary
- Hospital Discharge summary
- Hard copy of the claim

The request for pre-certification override will be processed as a retrospective review for inpatient admission and reviewed against appropriate medical necessity criteria by an inpatient RN Care Oversight Nurse. A determination for retrospective review must be made within 30 days of receipt of request. If the request meets medical necessity, the nurse will fax a certification approval letter to the submitting provider. There is no need to resubmit the claim, as it will be reprocessed internally by CHS-LA. If the request does not meet medical necessity criteria, the request will be forwarded to the appropriate medical director for physician review and determination. The provider will be notified via fax of the physician's review determination decision. Professional providers should validate the POS that was submitted on final bill from the facility where their services were rendered. Providers who bill an inpatient POS on an outpatient or observation stay should continue to correct their claims and resubmit without a need for following these pre-cert override provisions. These claims are receiving a Rejection Code of 295.

Claims Processing Update - TPL

April 15, 2013

The issue of TPL information not being provided to CHS-LA on the enrollment files for disenrolled members has been resolved. As of April 15, 2013, Molina has provided the updated TPL information for members who were previously enrolled with CHS-LA. Providers who received rejection codes of 287 or 290 because of this issue are encouraged to resubmit their claims.

CMS to Hold Series of Conference Calls for Exchange Stakeholders

The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) will be holding a series of stakeholder consultation calls for states with federally facilitated exchanges (FfEs) (including partnership exchanges) or state-based health insurance exchanges, now also referred to as "marketplaces." The calls will provide updates on policies and operations of the exchanges and provide stakeholders with an opportunity to provide comments and ask questions.

There will be multiple calls during the week of April 29 - May 3. Please note that all calls are state specific, and you should only call into your own state's teleconference. Registration is required. Menveo MenA vial redesign

Novartis has redesigned the Menveo MenA vial as shown. The Menveo vaccine content, the dosing and administrative schedule, the external packaging, and the NDC, 460208-0208-41, remain the same; it is only the shape of the Menveo MenA vial that has changed.

McKesson will begin filling your provider orders with the redesigned vial effective Monday, April 22, 2013.

Here is some important news about Menveo (Meningococcal [Groups A, C, Y and W-135] Oligosaccharide Diphtheria CRM₁₉₇ Conjugate Vaccine). The Menveo MenA vial has been redesigned:

- ✓ **Revised vial shape:**
The new vial is now 3 mm taller
- ✓ **A slightly longer and straighter neck area:**
This creates a wider channel and less protrusion of the stopper into the vial
- ✓ **While the vial has been redesigned, the Menveo vaccine has not changed:**
 - The product information (PI), NDC, vaccine contents, dosing and administrative schedule, and both the external packaging and box storage space are the same
 - You may order Menveo using the same NDC



The Louisiana Immunization Program is proud to announce that Gina Deris, former Louisiana Shots for Tots State Coordinator has been selected as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Childhood Immunization Champion for Louisiana.
