With this year's event being held in Arlington, VA, participants were given an opportunity to visit Capitol Hill and meet with local Congressional members. Congress was in recess so the LA AAP leaders met with staff to stress the importance of putting children first in policy and funding. The Chapter also asked for a push to extend the enhanced payment rates for primary care past 2014.

Visiting Professorship Available

Supported by a grant from the Department of Justice, the Medical Home for Children Exposed to Violence has established a visiting professorship program for pediatricians and medical home partners interested in improving their understanding and skills to assess and care for children exposed to multiple types of violence. There are 4 scholarships available to cover 2 days of expenses for one speaker.

Flu Vaccine for VFC Providers

To: Vaccines For Children Providers

Subject: Inactivated Influenza Vaccine (IIV) and Live Attenuated Influenza Vaccine (LAIV4)

Please be advised that we presently have limited amounts of seasonal Sanofi "preservative free" Inactivated Influenza Vaccine (IIV) for all children aged 6 months through 35 months available and 36 months through 18 years of age. We also have limited amount of LAIV4.

Please remember that our supplies will be in incremental allotments. However, ultimately sufficient vaccine will become available. We will notify you as soon as we have access to more of our allotments. Follow ordering guidelines by ordering what you need for the month (not for the whole season), and re-order once a month. As the vaccine quantities are initially limited, you may receive a portion of what you ordered based on your pro-rata share of the quantities available to us. Providers should plan to use this "once a month" ordering system until we advise you that the vaccine supply has become more plentiful. Vaccines For Children providers may begin vaccinating their children immediately upon receipt of vaccine.

As usual your collaboration and understanding is appreciated. Inquiries may be directed to the Immunization Program at 504-838-5300. This communication should be printed and kept for reference with the OPH Immunization Policies and Procedures Manual.

SUIDA Recipe- Apple Cinnamon Breakfast Quesadillas

Studies show children who eat breakfast have better attendance in school, improved test scores, superior nutrition and are less likely to be overweight. Whether we are an adult or a child, eating a morning meal improves our mood, sharpens our minds and prevents us from getting too hungry before lunch. These quick and easy, yet wholesome, breakfast quesadillas support a healthy and smart start to any day of the week!

Ingredients:

Nonstick cooking spray
4 (10-inch) flour whole-grain tortillas
1 cup chunky applesauce
4 ounces Cabot 50% Reduced Fat Cheddar, grated (about 1 cup)
2 tablespoons light brown sugar
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 tablespoon melted Cabot Salted Butter
1/2 cup Cabot Light Sour Cream

Directions:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Coat baking sheet with cooking spray.

Spread applesauce over two tortillas. Top with cheese and remaining tortillas.

In small bowl, mix together brown sugar and cinnamon. Brush tops of quesadillas with butter and sprinkle with half of sugar-cinnamon mixture.

Bake for 6 to 10 minutes or until golden brown. Set aside to cool.

Meanwhile, stir sour cream into remaining sugar-cinnamon mixture.

Cut each quesadilla into quarters. Serve topped with dollops of sour cream mixture.
